# a. Reseeding Bare spots

Fall and Spring are the best times to try to reseed bare spots in your lawn.

Below are the steps you should follow.

### Prepare the planting area

- 1) Aerate the soil by using a rake. For larger areas machines are available to break up the soil.
- 2) Buy cool weather grass seed. Do some research as maintenance and watering requirements vary. Be aware that some varieties of grass such as Bermuda grass are considered invasive.

#### Pre-germinate grass seed

- 1. Soak your seed in a burlap bag or cheese cloth for 24 hours in water.
- 2. Spread the seed out on a clean, dry surface after draining it.
- 3. Leave the seed to dry for 48 hours in a warm area around 60° to 65°F.
- 4. When little white sprouts begin to emerge from the seed coat, the grass seed is ready to be planted.

# **Spread the Grass Seed**

Place the seeds in a spreader or scatter them by hand. Once the grass seed has been distributed, lightly rake the soil with topsoil to cover the seeds and then spray the area with water. A new lawn should be watered every day until the seedlings are about 1 inch tall. Then, you can water every other day for another three weeks to help the grass become established.
